

Here is a copy of the crochet hat pattern that I showed you at the Tuesday meeting.
It is really easy and can be worked up in a few hours.

If you want to make some I will deliver them to Renita Sullivan to distribute to All Children's Hospital.

I chose to use a lighter weight baby yarn and a size F needle. This was originally made for the colder climate in Massachusetts, and I wanted a lighter weight for Florida.



Easy-Peasy Hat

I used Lion Brand Homespun and a 6 or 6.5 crochet hook. The entire hat is made with single crochet. You make a long rectangle and then close the side and the top. The corkscrews need to be attached before you close the top.

Loosely make a chain that measures the desired depth. First row single crochet in back chain. Turn, and single crochet next row, and repeat to desired length.

Child Small: Depth 6.5" (Length will be 18")

Child Medium: Depth 7" (Length will be 19")

Child Large: Depth 7.5" (Length will be 20")

Adult Small/Medium: Depth 8" (Length will be 21")

Adult Large: Depth 9" (Length will be 23")

Corkscrew: Make a chain the desired length (I made 30-31 chains). Double crochet in 3rd chain from hook, work 2 more double crochet in the same chain, 3 double crochet in each chain to the end. Cut yarn, leaving tail for sewing.
